

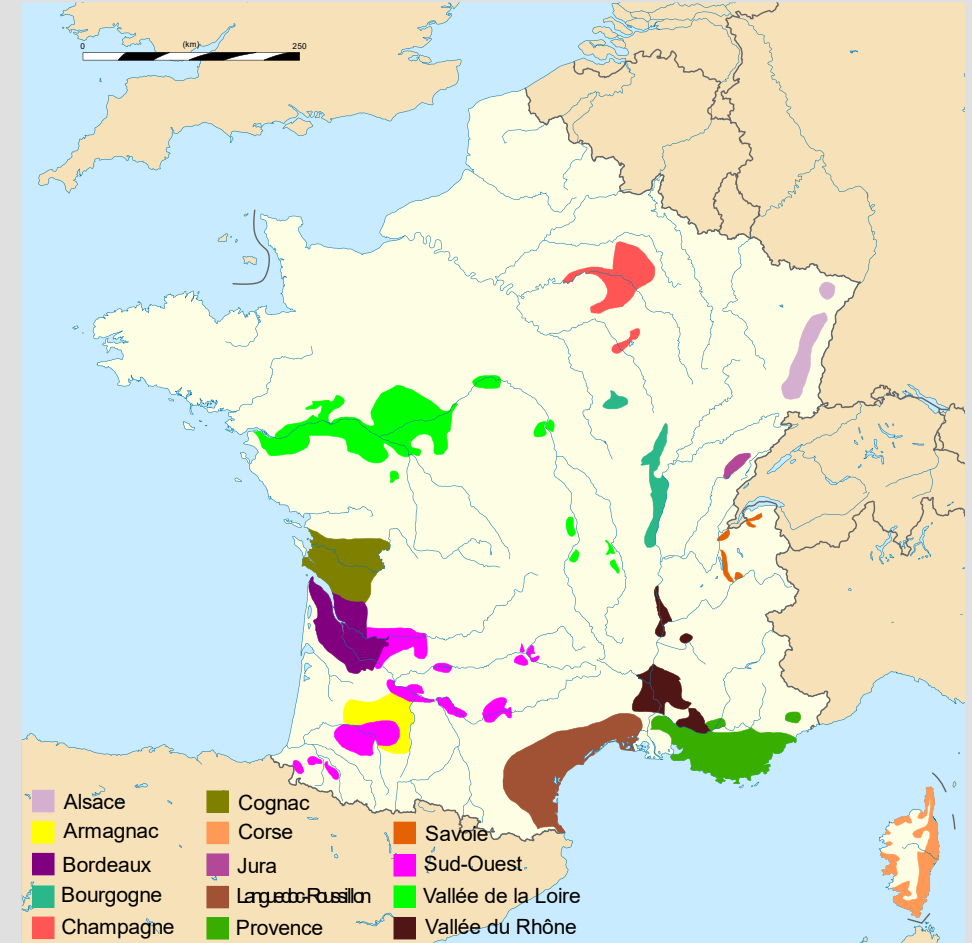

- Vitis Vinifera
- Other Vitis Varieties
- 1850's – USA – France
- Feeds on Roots
- 40% of French Grapes Gone
- Grafting onto American rootstock
- Sand, Slate

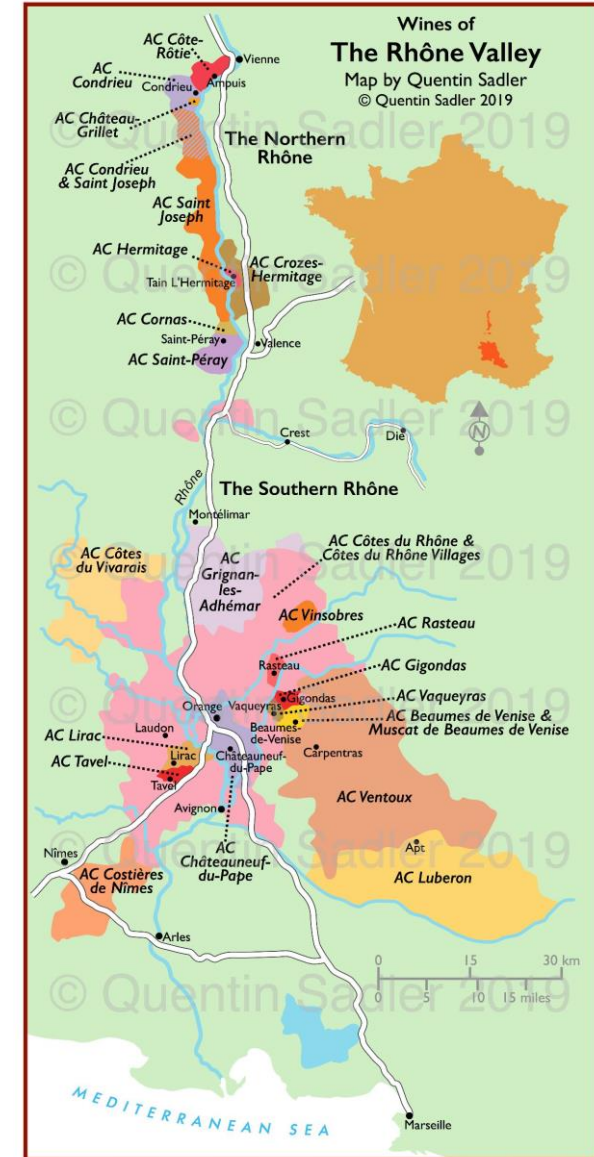

The Art of Blending

- Merlot – Softer, rounder wines, red and blue fruit aromas
- Cabernet Sauvignon – structure, tannins, black fruits
- Cabernet Franc – freshness, aromatic complexity
- Petit Verdot – finish
- Malbec – attack
- Carmenere - finesse

 - Chateaneuf-du-Pape
 - Cotes-du-Rhone
- Northern Rhone
 - Hermitage (Knight)
 - Cote-Rotie
- Shiraz
- Grenache
- Viognier
- Icons (Chave, Chapoutier, Jaboulet, Rostaing, Beaucastel, Villard, Guigal, Rayas, Henri Bonneau)
